
A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CONTROLLED SUBSTANCES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 329, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2 amended by adding a new section to part III to be appropriately
3 designated and to read as follows:

4 "§329- Prescription of opioids; mail-back envelope
5 required. A health care professional or pharmacist who
6 dispenses any opioid drug shall include with the dispensed drug,
7 instructions for disposing of any unused portion of the drug,
8 and a pre-addressed, postage prepaid envelope or package that
9 the person to whom the drug was dispensed may use to mail any
10 unused portion of the drug to a medication disposal program in
11 the State."

12 SECTION 2. New statutory material is underscored.

13 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

Opioid; Mail-Back Envelope; Drug Disposal

Description:

Requires a health care professional or pharmacist who dispenses any opioid drug to include with the drug instructions for disposing of any unused portion, along with a pre-addressed envelope or package that can be used to mail any unused portion to a medication disposal program in the State at no cost to the person to whom the drug was dispensed.
